A Definition for hermeneutics: The study of the Bible)

The Purpose of this chapter: Pg. 74

To delineate the common "hermeneutics" of most believers with its strengths and weaknesses. Namely: Determining Biblical interpretations that are ______ and belongs to the first century alone, and interpretations that transcend culture.

 Our Common Mistake: Pg. 75 We bring our "enlightened" sense to the text and apply all we can to our own situation. What does not seem to apply is simply left in the first century application because of selective "common sense" is our biggest mistake. 2 Tim. 3:14-16, vs. 5:23 1 Cor. 11:14, vs. 11:15 1 Cor. 14:34-35, vs. 14:1-5,26-33, 39-40 The Basic Rule: Pg. 77 "A text can not what it never could have to its author or his readers."
The Second Rule: Pg. 78 Whenever we share life situations (contexts) with the first century hearers, God's word to us is the same as his Word to them.
Problem #1 – Extended Applications: Pg. 79 What similarities might be aligned between first and 21 st – Century? 1 Cor. 6:1-11 PRINCIPLE: When comparable situations and comparable particulars are found in the 1 st and 21 st Century the contemporary interpretation should be limited to the intent.
Problem #2 – Particulars not Comparable: Pg. 81 Two kinds of texts: Scriptures that speak to 1 st century issues but have no 21 st century / comparison. (1 Cor. 10:23-11:1)
Scriptures that speak to 1 st century issues but very likely do not speak to 21 st century counterparts. (1 Cor. 5:1-11)
 Three steps: Pg. 82 1. Do careful Exegesis. 2. Avoid deciding on a principle that is applied to situations at random. 3. Distinguish between matters of from matters that count. Matters of indifference in the Epistles (e.g. food, drink observance of days) are likely still matters of
