- 6. Reading the Bible will not secure our salvation.
- 7. We are saved by grace.
- 8. And because we are saved by **grace** we want to do the **will** of the Father.

- 9. So to know that will, we read His Words.
- 10. Reading the Bible helps us to know the <u>will</u> of the Father.
- 11. Habits take 21 days to develop.
- 12. It's easier to make a new habit if we tie it to existing habits.

- 13. Quality is better than **quantity** when it comes to reading the Bible.
- 14. Keep the objective in mind: Continue in His word. Learn the truth. And implement the truth to break free from sin.
- 15. Pray for <u>understanding</u> before you read. Pray for God to speak to your <u>heart</u>.




ESV


